**Entries Received:** Entries will be received at the Pavillion on Thursday evening 3 May from 5:00pm to 8:00pm and Friday morning 4 May 2018 from 8:00am to 9:00am. Any exhibitors requiring assistance with their entries are most welcome at the Pavilion on Thursday evening.

**Entries Collected:** Exhibits can be removed from 8.30pm to 9.30pm Saturday 5 May or Sunday 6 May 10.00am to 11.00am

### Entry Fee:

- Classes 1 – 92a: \$0.50 per class (maximum \$10.00)
- Classes 93 – 111: \$1.00 per class (maximum \$10.00)
- Classes 112 – 119: Free

### Prizes:

- Classes 1 – 92a: 1st - \$3.00 plus card, 2nd – \$1.00 plus card. (Except if trophy is 1st prize)
- Classes 93 – 111: 1st - \$5.00 plus card, 2nd - \$3.00 plus card. (Except for trophy classes)
- Classes 112 – 119: 1st - \$3.00 plus card and ribbon, 2nd - \$1.00 plus card and ribbon. (Except if trophy is 1st prize)
- Sashes for Most Successful Exhibitor, Reserve Champion, Champion and Grand Champion

### Conditions:

- An entry form must be completed for each entry
- Proof of age must be provided to the Steward upon request
- Containers and collections must not be less than 5 cuts.
- Society bottles available if required, but not containers.
- Classes 1-92a must be grown by the exhibitor or have been in their possession for 3 months.
- Novice classes are where the exhibitor has never won 3 x 1st prizes in that section.
- At the discretion of the judge a prize may not be awarded.
- Judges decision is final.

## DECORATIVE ARRANGEMENTS

### Guidelines for Competitors:

- Exhibits judged on interpretation of schedule, creativity, originality, principles & elements of design.
- Plant material should predominate over all other components in a design.
- Exhibits must be the individual exhibitors own work.
- No artificial plant material may be used (eg. Manufactured or artificial flowers/foliage unless specified).
- Fresh plant material must be in water or water retaining material that does not alter the effect of the arrangement.
- A design must not be changed in any way after it is judged.
- The judge's decision is final.

### OPEN DECORATIVE

- Open to professionals and others
- Exhibitors may compete above their section but not below
- Flowers not necessarily home grown unless stated
- May use any props or embellishments unless otherwise stated
