Entries Close: 12.00pm Monday 30 April 2018

Entries taken: All exhibits to be delivered to the Main Pavilion on Sunday 29 April 2018 from 9.30am to 12.00pm or Monday 30 April 2018 from 9.30am to 12.00pm.

Entries collected: Exhibits can be collected from the pavilion on Sunday 6 May 2018 between 9.00am and 10.30am. For no reason can work be collected earlier. Any uncollected entries will be left at the Secretary's office for collection on Sunday 6 May until 4.00pm.

Entry Fees: Open Sections \$1.00 per entry, Junior Sections \$0.50 per entry (unless in open class).

Prizes: 1st - \$5.00 (or trophy), 2nd - \$2.00. Place cards will be awarded at Judge's discretion

Special prizes: Champion Exhibits will be awarded in each of the listed sub-sections at the Judge's discretion. Other awards will be awarded to selected categories in each class.

Trophy sponsors: Lisa Dees, Narrabri Show Ladies Auxiliary, Embroiderer's Guild, Christine Cain, Needlework Stewards.

Conditions:

- An official entry form must be completed for each entry and submitted at time of delivery.
- No late entries will be accepted.
- All exhibits must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor and must not have won first prize at a previous Narrabri Show.
- No articles may be entered in more than one class.
- All articles must be clean and pressed.
- Each article must be clearly ticketed with exhibitor's name and class entered and attached face down on the back of the work. It is suggested that fine work which might be damaged by pins, should have a ticket attached by tacking stitch.
- Entries forwarded by post must be firmly packed bearing sender's name, address, telephone number and class number. Return postage must be prepaid. Exhibits will be repacked and returned after the show.
- School Students must register age on entry form. Proof of age must be provided to the Steward upon request
- Baby's layette and small pieces of needlework may be mounted on light cardboard, attached by tacking stitch, but must be able to be overall judged.
- Any work sealed in plastic must be able to be removed for judging.
- The right is reserved to alter any class entered by exhibitors or to create additional classes where warranted, after consultation and agreement between Judge and Stewards.
- All care is taken, but no responsibility can be accepted for any article lost or damaged.
- Judges decision is final
